Protected Characteristics:

Age: Refers to a person belonging to a particular age or range of ages

Disability: A person has a disability if s/he has a physical or mental impairment which has substantial and long-term adverse effect on that person's ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities.

Gender Re-assignment: process of transitioning from one gender to another.

Marriage and Civil-Partnership: Marriage is identified as a union between a man and a woman or two people of the same sex. Civil Partnerships must be treated on the same basis as marriage in a wide range of legal matters.

Pregnancy and Maternity: Pregnancy is the condition of being pregnant. Maternity refers to the period after the birth.

Race: Refers to a group of people defined by their race, colour and nationality (including citizenship) ethnic or national origins.

Religion and Belief: This also includes non-belief eg athesism. Generally a belief or religion should affect your life choices or the way you live in order for it to be included in the protected characteristics.

Sex: A male or female

Sexual Orientation: Whether a person's sexual attraction is towards their own sex, the opposite sex or to both sexes.
